Billy and Clyde Alstrom Win The Harris RPM Dash



As usual the weather forecast called for a cold front to come in the area on Friday. The rain and the clouds moved out

by early Friday morning and the skies cleared. The bass that were sitting on the bed hoping to have stable weather to finish their yearly spawn. That didn't work and they headed to deep water to wait for the next warming trend. A lot of our anglers were hoping to find the fish that they had seen in practice, waiting for them Saturday morning. That didn't happen. About the only thing left sitting on beds were 11 inch fish. Billy and Clyde Alstrom were just going to try the proven February pattern for bass. Flip the pads. Bass love pads in February. They went to Little Harris and started pitching and flipping pads. They caught a good fish, then another, and then another. The pattern repeated itself over and over and they managed to bring in 21.76 pounds of largemouth. There lunker with 5.34 pounds so the other four averaged over 4 pounds apiece. That's a great day on Lake Harris. They were almost 5 pounds better than the second place team.

Speaking of the second-place team, that honor belonged to Roy Raulerson and Ryan Cooper. They had located some fish the weekend before and were hoping that they would still be there. Although smaller than they caught them in practice, they were still there. Although they actually were sitting on the bed, they remained in the area and were susceptible to a slow flipping presentation. As the sun came up and the water temperature started to climb they flipped over to an isolated lily pad and felt a slight heaviness in the line. They set the hook just because it was free and realized they had hooked a good one. She would weigh 7.69 pounds and claim the Quantum Lunker award. They put together a nice limit that went 16.83 pounds to earn their second check of the day.

2017 Team Anglers of the Year, Ryan and Steve Mekdeci, would earn a third-place check this February afternoon. They brought in 16.20 pounds with their five fish. They did something a little different this time. They are normally slow wormers but today they worked Rattle traps. They are finally letting some hydrilla grow in the Harris chain and the Mekdeci's took advantage of it. They would rip the traps off the grass and the fish would snatch it. Fourth-place belongs to the team of Gene Goldman and Gaither Davis. They brought 16.07 pounds to the scales and caught them all with the slow worm presentation. Fifth-place belong to Ken and Stephen Whitlow. They brought in 13.65 pounds of Harris Bass to earn them a nice little check.

Overall we had a record high of 55 boats fishing the Harris chain. We are the largest B.A.S.S. club in the state as well as the country. We have more members in our organization then some states do. Thanks everyone for making this such a great club.

You guys ended up bringing 226 fish to the scales that weighed an impressive 451.07 pounds. That included 31 limits. That made it a two pound average per fish. And what makes it even more impressive is that we only lost one fish for the entire tournament. Great fish care everyone and we are really looking forward to another great tournament on Kissimmee out of Camp Mack. We will see you there.

One thing that had us feeling good about our decisions is everywhere we went we were fishing right next to the Crandons and if you're around them, you're probably making the right decisions. Unless you are bed fishing behind them... That's never a good idea.

We are sitting in 16th place for team of the year at the moment and are hoping to move back into the top 10 after this month's tournament on the Kissimmee Chain. We have an uphill battle for sure and our goal of team of the year might already be out of reach, but we will see how the rest of the year goes. One tournament at a time.
